MARTIN

KATE

Have I added a few strands of gray?

MARTIN

Am I really supposed to tell a woman who is 39 that she has gray hair?

KATE

I'm not afraid of looking older. Not when I'm on the verge of this kind of a discovery. Do you know what this is? What I'm in the midst of?

MARTIN

(*Pours two drinks*) Yes – you've plopped yourself into the middle of a Jules Verne novel.

KATE

It was HG Wells. And he was only the first phase -- science fiction. I know the math which makes it real. True. Nonfiction.

MARTIN

KATE

Traveling back in time?

Yes.

MARTIN

You'll loose your tenure.

KATE

(referencing the machine) There's something askew, Martin. I programmed in an exact day and time.

MARTIN

Like a television program.

KATE

Almost. But there was a discrepancy in the focus as if two probabilities of the same time and place were overlapping. I have to try it again.

MARTIN

No. It's too risky.

KATE

Why?

MARTIN

It just seems that time travel has that reputation. More specifically, we have a guest coming in tonight from the States – staying with us. Here.

KATE

Oh yes. The bride.

MARTIN

You forgot. I've been cooking for a week and at the last minute, a wedding you arranged slips your mind.

KATE

For a second, only a second. I was immersed in equations.
